

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The 70th National Meeting of the AIC has just ended. It included "governance" sessions and "technical" sessions. The meeting was fairly well attended although the local response was not as good as expected. The program was certainly excellent with two concurrent sessions both Friday and Saturday. The Ethics Award talk by Dr. Margot O'Toole was inspirational, and the Chemical Pioneers' presenta-



tions were outstanding. The Chemical Pioneers' program featured two Nobel Laureates (Drs. Barton and Merrifield) and two other world-class speakers (Dr. Olah and Rabo). The Gold Medal talk by Dr. Fred Basolo was a fine example of both science and humanism. The AIC has always had truly excellent Gold Medal awardees—this year was no exception.

The Board Meeting was very productive. The Finance Committee chaired by Treasurer Bill Hanford, Jr. reviewed the 1992 CPA financial report and determined that the AIC operated with a small profit during 1992 which further reduced the negative General Fund owner's equity on the December 31, 1992 Balance Sheet. The General Funds of AIC as of the date reported showed balances of -\$13.8K, +\$18.0 for the Public Education Fund, and +\$12.8 for the Life Fellow Fund. Thanks to a \$10,000 donation by Du Pont De Nemours and Company and continued control of expenses, January's General Fund owner's equity for The Institute was positive. This is the first time in many years that our General Fund has had a positive owner's equity, which means The Institute has attained a degree of financial stability. The Board approved the 1993 budget which, along with the 1992 budgeted and actual figures, is shown below:

Other Board actions were: 1) reviewed the preliminary AIC Strategic Plan; 2) encouraged the National Certification Commissioners to expand its program; 3) all standing committee reports submitted were reviewed and accepted; 4) the 1992 Membership Campaign was reviewed and suggestions were given on how to implement the 1993 Membership Campaign; 5) reviewed the 1992 AICF Fund Development Campaign, results, and follow-up process; 6) a discussion on AIC Local Institutes' Bylaws revisions; 7) approved preliminary plans for the 1994 National Meeting which will be held in Indianapolis and chose the San Francisco Bay area as the site for the 1995 National Meeting; 8) discussed the National Office and two personnel items.

Bradford R. Stanerson, an AIC member since 1959, received the 1993 Charles Lathrop Parsons Award from the ACS. The award is presented no more often than every two years for outstanding public service by an ACS member.

Obituaries

Max Kronstein, a research chemist, died November 21, 1992 at his home in Riverdale, NY. A native of Basel, Switzerland, he received his doctorate at the University of Leipzig in 1922. From 1946 to 1955 he taught at New York University's College of Engineering and stayed as a research scientist until 1973. His specialties were polymers and surface coatings. He was elected to AIC membership in 1950.

Billy B. Hibbard, died October 16, 1992. He was elected to AIC membership in 1968 and was an AIC Fellow.

Gilbert Shull, died November 30, 1992. He was elected to AIC membership in 1957 and was an Emeritus Fellow.

Herbert Robinson, died January 19, 1993 after a prolonged serious illness. He was elected to AIC membership in 1957 and was an Emeritus Fellow.

Eugene M. Grivsky, passed away on February 19 at Fairfax Hospital of congestive heart failure. Grivsky, 81, was retired researcher in organic chemistry and held patents for drugs used in the treatment of cancer and epilepsy. A native of Pskov, Russia, Grivsky was raised in Estonia and Latvia.

He became a Life Fellow of the AIC in 1969.
